From schools

- Our school has been inundated with requests for places for keyworker and vulnerable pupils. So much so, we have not been able to open fully to any year groups and remain open only for those keyworker and vulnerable children. We have approximately 160 children in throughout the week so we have staff in school providing child care for these, and other staff at working from home to provide the online learning.
- As well as this, we are still providing our care packs for those families most in need these include breakfast supplies and essentials we have had donated. We have a fantastic group of parents who we have branded the 'WM community angels' who have been delivering these to the families who need them. We have also had some very kind donations from local businesses such as Wicks (paint and decorating supplies), Dunelm and Morrisons (toasters) and bacon roll vouchers for staff.
- We are very thankful for those who have supported our school and community during this difficult time.
- Thank you for the prayers. They are needed. Yes, we have Yr, Y1 and Y6 returned from June 1st.
- We have 8 'bubbles': 2 x Y6; 2 x Y1;2 x YR; 2 x Key Worker groups
- All well so far and children are very good at adapting to new routines and structures. Tricky for the littlest ones who of course want to hug and kiss their friends.
- Life looks very different with no assembles, separate meal times and lunch breaks. We have a one way system for pick up and drop off and all have slightly staggered start and finish times.
- Parents and staff have been very supportive and thoughtful.
