- Alpha Plus: A group of 8 10 men who finished the Alpha course and wanted something more. Facilitated by James Baron (Lyminster Church) and Andy. Held on Wednesday evenings. Looking deeper into Alpha themes.
- Sunday Services: No visiting teams allowed in at present because of Covid 19 restrictions. Dominic runs a catholic service in the chapel.
- Prison General: Pray for the Governor (Andy Davy) to be open to effective gospel ministry, and for all the staff there.
